

Area Demographics

New forecasts produced by the Atlanta Regional Commission estimate Henry County will continue to develop with new residents, reaching 370,400 residents by the year 2050. This forecast would equate to a seventy percent increase over the benchmark year 2015 used in the forecasts. In 2015, Henry County's population was 217,700.

The estimated growth rate places Henry County second, behind only Forsyth County, for the largest population percentage change over the next thirty years. As a whole, the twenty-one county metro Atlanta region is expected to add 2.9 million residents totaling 8.6 million by 2050.



"The Sunset Strip"

"Sunset Strip was owned by Ken Martin, an aircraft mechanic, businessman and pilot. Ken started a small company named 'Piedmont Engineering' which rebuilt engines and performed aircraft maintenance/ inspections. Rogers Martin, Ken's son, grew up on the field with a wrench in his hand and followed in his father's footsteps as an aircraft mechanic."

The earliest depiction which has been located of Sunset Strip was a 1962 aerial view by Rogers Martin which showed the airfield under construction and the adjacent house having just been started.
